This was the first season that Fort Myers played on a lighted field at home. The first night game in Fort Myers was the season opener vs Punta Gorda, a 13-0 Victory.

Clare Williams caught 3 TD passes vs Bartow which established a record (tied 1948, 1968, 1985) for TD catches in a game.

Louis Kennedy boomed a 72 yard punt vs Bartow to set the All-time Record for longest punt.

Sarasota was established as the new Thanksgiving Day opponent replacing St.Petersburg. The Thanksgiving Day game would last 27 years and the Series would last 40 consecutive years.
