**AWARDS, FACTS, HIGHLIGHTS, AND HONORS**

Fort Myers played their first opponent from outside the state of Florida(Rhea County, Dayton, Tennessee). They were the Southeast Tennessee Champions (9-0-1) and played Fort Myers in the Coconut Bowl. Fort Myers dropped the tough contest 7-0. Rhea County were State Champions in 1932 and 70-8 over the previous six seasons.

Jimmie Randall and Harold Stambaugh were selected to play in the State All-Star game in Jacksonville, and were both **1st Team All-State** selections.

Jimmie Randall was the leading scorer in the Conference and was named Captain of the All-Conference Team. He established several school records: Most return yards in a career and a season (491), most return TDS in a career and a season (4), punt return TDS in a career and a season (3), most punt return YDS in a career and a season (348), longest punt return (95 YDS vs Bartow) and longest kickoff return (95 YDS vs Palmetto).

Jimmie Randall became the 2nd Greenie to lead his team in Rushing and Passing in the same season.
